NATURE OF BUSINESS

The Llandudno Special Rating Area NPC is a non-profit company set up in terms of the municipal by-laws of the City of Cape Town (CoCT) which acts as the management body in respect of the Special Rating Area (SRA) determined by the CoCT in terms of section 22 of the Property Rates Act in respect of a defined geographical area. The source of revenue of the company is additional property rates billed by the CoCT to the registered property owners of Llandudno which funds are utilised to supplement services provided by the CoCT. These services include the provision of security for the common/public areas of the SRA/Llandudno, environmental maintenance and removal of alien vegetation, cleaning and tidying public open spaces and other community related services.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

The financial position and operating results of the company for the year ended 30 June 2016 are adequately reflected in the accompanying annual financial statements.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Presentation of Financial Statements

annual financial statements in accordance have been prepared with International Financial Reporting Standards for Small and Medium-Sized Entities and in the manner required the Companies Act, No 71 of 2008. The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis and incorporate the principal accounting policies set out below. These accounting policies are consistent, in all material respects, with those applied in the previous period.

Recognition of Assets and Liabilities

Assets are recognised if they meet the definition of an asset, it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the asset will flow to the company and the cost or fair value can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are only recognised if they meet the definition of a liability, it is probable that future economic benefits economic benefits with the liability will flow from the company and the cost or fair value can be measured reliably.

Property, Plant and Equipment

The company has not complied with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 16 on Property, Plant and Equipment as to the capitalisation of costs and depreciating of assets over their useful lives. The company's policy is to write off property, plant and equipment on acquisition as a capital expense in the statement of income and retained earnings.

Financial Instruments

The company classifies its financial instruments into the following categories : receivables, cash and cash equivalents and payables.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables are stated at cost less an allowance for doubtful debts. The allowance raised is the amount needed to reduce the carrying value to the expected future cash flows.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and deposits at call with banks. Cash equivalents comprise highly liquid investments that are convertible to cash with insignificant risk of changes in value. Cash and cash equivalents are measured at fair value.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables are measured at fair value.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue comprises special rates levies recognised on issue of monthly invoices by the City of Cape Town to all home owners in the suburb of the special rating area of Llandudno. Donations received are accounted for on receipt from the donor.

Taxation

The company has been approved as a public benefit organisation (PBO) by of the South African Revenue Service. In terms of Section 30(3) of the Income Tax Act, income of any PBO is exempt from income tax to the extent that it has not arisen from integral, occasional or approved business or trading activity. In terms of Section 10(1)(cN) regarding any taxable business or trading income of a PBO, the greater of 5% of the trading income, or R200,000, is tax free. The taxable portion of а PBO's trading income is taxed at 28%.
